Volunteer Days – Project Days

We have completed 2 Project Days so far this year. The third Project Day will be completed before this newsletter is published. Thank you to all Volunteers who helped with Projects this year. Our remaining Project Day is scheduled for September 16th (this is also the day for Roadside Cleanup). We will meet at the BPLA Picnic Area on the South Lake at 9:00 AM, snacks and water are provided.

Projects completed so far this year include: Loon Nest platforms installed at ice out, BPLA Fishing Dock put into South Lake, picked up downed branches at South Pine Lake Public Landing caused by winter snows, installed Kaeder Creek sign, replaced Turtle Creek sign damaged in the winter, trimmed Pine Lake Overlook Trail, removed lake plants adjacent to the Fishing Dock to allow easier fishing, walked Strawberry Creek to remove fallen trees or debris restricting water flow.

Planned projects: pruning brushy shrubs in the Buffer Zone by Picnic Area, removing lake plants by fishing dock to open-up areas to fish, trimming weed and brush around various BPLA signage around the lakes, remove debris from the Dam on Big Pine Lake, remove branches from inactive beaver dam in Strawberry Creek to allow spawning fish to swim through, pull out Fishing Dock.

Volunteering to help on projects is a great way to meet fellow Lake People and help beautify our lakes and shoreline. Many hands help make quick work on the Saturday morning Projects. Please contact me with your ideas on any other projects for BPLA Volunteer Projects. drgrouse@yahoo.com

Buffer Zones update

Another successful planting was done at the Schussler's over the July 4th weekend. They are thrilled with the results and the lakes have gained ~100' of protected shoreline! They are testing a weed control blanket for us. It's much thicker than other materials we've used to wipe out the canary reed grass and anything else under it without using chemicals. Holes just large enough for the new plants are cut into the material and the new plants fill the hole.



We have found a source of willow, a couple miles west of Pine Lake. It's on a county road that we should notify before cutting. Always open to additional sources, especially near the lakes.

I'm always looking for pictures, information, and testimonials of previous projects. BPLA members have been doing this for over 40 years – that's quite a bit of history to fill in.

Fisheries, Water Quality and Fireworks

He received a bachelor's degree from UW-Stevens Point and a master's degree from South Dakota State University in Fisheries. Over the past 20 years, Matt has worked for area fisheries offices in Duluth, Lake Superior, Walker, and Grand Rapids in various roles, most recently as the assistant area fisheries supervisor in Grand Rapids. Matt's first day at the office was August 2. Big Pine Lakes Association welcomes Matt to our area; we are happy to have the position filled. We are looking for good things from Fisheries to continue in the future under his guidance.

Water Quality

For the past 10 years, your contributions to BPLA have been used to cover the cost of testing the quality of water in our lakes and major contributing streams. The results of these tests are posted on the BPLA website and are also shared with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA).

Water samples are tested for phosphorus, nitrogen and chlorophyll. Secchi Disc tests are also conducted, which is a measure of water clarity. Samples are taken at four locations in the lakes and one sample each is taken from Strawberry Creek and Pine River.

The MPCA uses the Environmental Quality Information System (EQuIS) to store water quality data from more than 17,000 Minnesota sampling locations. EQuIS contains information from Minnesota streams and lakes dating back to 1926.

The MPCA used this data in conducting surface water assessments for the Kettle River and St. Croix River watersheds over the past couple years to determine whether water bodies meet state water quality standards.

In general, the data through 2022 shows a gradual improvement in water quality in our lakes. EQuIS data can be accessed at pca.state.mn.us/surface-water. BPLA plans to continue sampling and testing to monitor the water quality in our lakes and streams. Once testing is completed for 2023, it will be posted on the BPLA website and with the MPCA.

Six Generations of Family Fishing

I have to say, it is awesome to see membership involvement in BPLA and the activities it sponsors. Thanks to all those who get involved. Recently, I received a letter from Lance Meier, who has a cabin on the north lake. His wife, Melanie, and various parts of his family have been on the lake for the past 114 years. They wanted to share their story of pulling fish out of the lakes as it spans over six generations of their family. Enjoy!



"This picture is of Alice Melin and of her father Zach Melin of Rush City. While this may look like an ordinary first fish picture, it is actually 114 years in the making. Alice is the 6th generation of two sides of her family to fish in the waters of the Pine Lakes. One set of Alice's Great-Great-Great-Grandparents (Gottfried and Rosalie Alleman) settled and began farming on the northwest corner of the south lake in 1908 and pulled many a fish out of the lake over the years. Richard (Dick) and Jenny Alleman still reside on the family farmstead and still occasionally throw a line in! Alice's Great-Great-Grandma was Anna (Alleman) Schuett and was an avid fisherwoman fishing off the dock at their home on the south lake along with her husband August. Alice's Great-Grandma is Audrey (Schuett) Meier who still runs to the lake quite often from their home south of Giese where she lives with her husband of 60 years, Jim.

This is where the double 6th generation fish comes in. Jim's grandparents and Alice's Great-Great-Great-Grandparents on that side were Carl and Catherine Meier who moved on to a farm on the west side of the south lake in 1930 and lived there with their children until later that decade.

Alice's Great-Great-Grandpa was John Meier who fished the lake as much as he could.

The Schuetts and Meiers became fast family friends culminating with the marriage of Jim and Audrey. Jim and Audrey have four sons. Alice's Grandpa is Tom Meier who settled in Rush City but spent many a day wetting a line in both lakes. Tom would drag his daughters out fishing all the time. His middle daughter, Katie, is Alice's mom who married Zach Melin from Rush City.

Alice caught her first fish off the dock at Lance and Melanie Meier's cabin on the west side of the north lake as the family was celebrating Jim and Audrey's 60th wedding anniversary Memorial Day weekend 2022 – thus becoming the 6th generation to experience the thrill of pulling in a 'lunker' from the lakes!"
