Water Quality

Water testing results for 2022 show a continued gradual improvement of the water quality in the lakes. This has been a trend for the past nine years of testing. Phosphorus and nitrogen are the primary nutrients in the water that support algal growth, that green slime that sometimes develops on the lake surface during the summer. The quantities of these nutrients have declined as can be seen on the graphs on the BPLA website.

Also, Secchi Disc readings have been gradually increasing which means the clarity of the water is improving. To view the graphs of the test results, go to <u>www.bigpinelakes.org</u> and scroll to Water Quality and Lake Information. Click on Water Quality Reports, then BPLA Water Quality Readings. While test results can vary from month to month and year to year, the red dotted line on the graphs shows the trends. My wife Pat and I plan to sample the lake water again this summer at the six locations sampled over the past nine years.

It is likely the ongoing trend of improved water quality is due to the efforts of many of you through good septic system maintenance, minimizing or eliminating fertilization of your lawn and installation of shoreline buffer zones. Efforts like these by everyone around the lakes will help to keep the recreational quality of our lakes in good shape.

Fisheries Update

The Minnesota DNR Hinckley Fisheries surveys for 2022 are completed. The Big Pine Lake survey is currently available online for review. The Pine Lake survey will be available online soon. Deb Vermeersch, Assistant Area Supervisor, MN DNR will be joining us at our upcoming Spring meeting to present their findings. If you're interested in looking at the information in closer detail, check out the links in the Water Quality & Lake Information page on the BPLA website (www.bigpinelakes.org)

The DNR Fisheries will not be stocking Walleyes this year. Their plan calls for stocking on even years only. The following are the stocking records currently available for past years stocking, including 2022. The numbers from 2021 represent the walleyes purchased and stocked directly by BPLA.

High Speed Fiber Internet: Call to Action

East Central Energy has recently proposed some major expansions to its high speed fiber internet service. That is some great news for BPLA and our neighbors in the area considering the experiences many of us have shared with the current provider. Although no specific announcements have been made regarding dates or specific service areas, ECE has suggested that plans will be developed based on needs of individual communities. So, BPLA is asking for your help.

History (summarized from eastcentralengergy.com)

In 2019, ECE conducted a feasibility study for bringing broadband internet to residents in its 14-county service area. The results of that study suggested excessive risk to the company resulting from the amount of money required to invest in fiber and related equipment; therefore, a decision was made to discontinue that project.

The pandemic proved that high speed internet is needed more than ever in rural areas. Federal and state governments recognize this need and have made funding more accessible in the recent months. As a result, ECE has decided to revisit this project. In 2021, the ECE board of directors voted to re-develop a plan to bring fiber to its entire service area. It has since conducted another feasibility study, which concluded that this project is achievable given appropriate assistance, such as grants and other sources of financial support. Over the next several months, ECE will be further developing its plan.

How Can You Help?

As part of this plan, ECE is reaching out to determine the level of interest in high speed fiber throughout its communities. While no guarantees can be made, the more interest an individual community expresses in the need for this service, the better the chance that community has of being prioritized when the plan roles out. Regardless, ECE's goal is to eventually provide service for all its members; not just those in higher populated areas.

Between our two lakes, we have approximately 315 households. That equals 315 voices that can send a message to ECE saying that we need high speed fiber in our neighborhood. In 2022, BPLA had 209 active members. Thank you for being members, by the way! We appreciate you. Now, we are you asking you to be a voice and contact ECE to express your interest in this future service. Additionally, we are asking that you pass the word on to neighbors and friends in the area. There are approximately 106 non-members who do not receive these newsletters and other forms of communication from BPLA. Convince them to join, while you're at it! But, ask them to reach out to ECE as well so that we can improve our connectivity up here sooner than later. This new service will benefit individual homes as well as businesses in the greater Finlayson area. All you have to do is share your local address and contact information with ECE so that they know the interest exists. The website is listed below. As always, BPLA will provide updates as ECE develops and implements its plan.
